3. Learning programme

Activity 1: Welcome reception		
Learning methods:	All the students who have participated in the mobilities will join in the library and have breakfast. Students will then move to the playground and distributed in groups to carry out some group dynamics.	
Learning outcomes:	Students will develop their personal and social competences as they: Get to know each student. Create an atmosphere of confidence and trust to carry out the week's program successfully.	

Activities 2 and 8: eTwinning Philosophy		
Learning methods:	The activity consists in introducing the theoretical concepts of sociability, peace, justice, etc. So that the subsequent debate is consistent. We'll use eTwinning to share knowledge and to collect the learning experience. It will be done from a philosophical, psychological and ethical perspective.	



	You will work with the Kialo-edu application, which allows us to draw up "theses on an issue", or also choose "pros or cons related to an inspiring sentence". We can also apply to a "Forum" the method of the "Debate League" (Network of Universities of Catalonia).
Learning outcomes:	The method of "reasoned debate" promotes critical thinking and careful consideration of the opinions of others. It is also intended to broaden the perspective on what justice is or how to achieve permanent and global peace. As students continue to use eTwinning, they develop their digital competence.

Activity 3: English	
Learning methods:	 Why aren't there more women in tech? This project aims to raise awareness of the lack of women in technology through in-group activities, and aims at empowering both women and men to advocate for change. Icebreaker: start the session with an icebreaker activity to get everyone comfortable and familiar with each other. This could be a round of introductions. Introduction to the topic: provide an overview of the current state of women in technology. Small group formation: form small groups to talk about the lack of women in the technology field and to compare the three countries. Brainstorming. Discussion: discuss the challenges faced by women in the field and why.
Learning outcomes:	 Raise students' awareness: the in-group activity will help raise awareness about the lack of women in the technology field and the challenges they have to face nowadays. Skill building: by organising and executing the activity, the students will build new skills such as project management, group-work and public speaking. Empowerment: by working together, female students will feel empowered and motivated to continue advocating for women in technology.

Activities 4 and 7: Literary creation: Tales of peace			
Learning methods:	Students from France, Italy and Spain will work on collaborative groups of native speakers, Spanish learners and students who do not speak Spanish. Students will work on tales about peace in Spanish and will have to mediate to explain the tales to the students who do not speak Spanish.

Activity 9: Salt's city hall reception		
Learning methods:	Students who have participated in the mobilities will be able to meet Salt's major and the city hall.	
Learning outcomes:	Students will be able to develop their citizenship competence and learn more about the institutions in Salt, Catalonia and Spain.	

Activity 10: Maths (CLIL)		
Learning methods:	Students will reflect on their learning process during their mobilities by doing a self-evaluation form and analysing the results using statistics. Students will be able to compare the results of different groups of students according to their nationalities, if they have hosted, if they have been hosted, their gender, etc.	
Learning outcomes:	Students will develop their Maths competence as they will have to represent and explain their self-evaluations with graphics.	



Students will also work on their personal, social and learning to learn competence as they will need to reflect on their own learning process and, later, compare it with that of the rest of
the group.

Activity 11: French / English / Citizenship, Policy and Law			
Learning methods:	All the students from 1st Batxillerato will participate in this activity along with European students. Those students for Institut Salvador Espriu who take "French" and "Citizenship, Policy and Law" subjects will take a leading role in this activity. Regardless of the classroom, all students will do the same activity. The activity will be done with different work groups (one student from each school). Each group will choose a Human Right. The students will make a description of the Human Right in French, Italian, Spanish and/or English. Students will have to cite an ONG from each country that works on this Human Right work. With the computer program "Canva", the students will make a poster. All the posters made will hang at the Infopoint in the hall of the centre.		
Learning outcomes:	 Research and in-depth study on human rights. Collaborative written and oral presentation in different European languages about NGOs that deal with these human rights. Share and show the work at the school's European infopoint 		

Activity 12: Girona's guided tour		
Learning methods:	Spanish students will prepare a guided visit around Girona city, with the help of Spanish teachers.	
Learning outcomes:	Students will be able to develop their communicative and multilingual competences and learn more about the history of Girona.
